On the Fringe

The existential weight of freedom is not limited to the sacred and the political. The urge for freedom also finds expression in our everyday lives, especially when we compare the practicality of ordinary moments with the lofty yet hollow demands of public life. In response, the artists in this exhibition refuse to be constrained by the expectations of mainstream norms. Instead, they put the inner world on display in opposition to predominant public rhetoric. Their art magnifies our ordinary lives, particularly the world behind closed doors and the world within. Indeed, these works show us how the private space can lay the foundation for resistance to the overwhelming narratives society enforces.

In On the Fringe, the human mind, once a zone of privacy and exclusion, with its cryptic musings and inclinations, comes out of incognito and we are all invited with convivial Yoruba greetings of e kaabo, to examine and confront the diversity and interactions of culture, choice, and identity—as we find them conspicuously displayed in the works of the feature artists and in the empirical world.

Rich in symbolism, idealisation and history, these works stand unbending in a landscape dominated by concepts of political correctness. They shake off the imposed notions of their institutional origins while picking up the threads of a shared imperial history. Furthermore, as the public space represents the meeting point of our multidimensional selves, the audience will discover what drives these artists to create and live through the canvas—a dedication to life.

Johnson Ocheja's portraits provide us with immediate examples of an alternative vision of identity. On the other hand, Chinaza Nkemka's synthetic-like images require longer contemplation to be captivated by them. Talut Kareem's polka-dotted diptych gives off a sense of fashion, resistance and self determination that comes with the sweet relief of

inhabiting one's space. Wasiu Eshinlokun's surrealist art, as in "Unearth" asks the viewer to break free from the status quo. Michelle Okpare's self portraits show the anxieties that follow us from the public space into our personal spaces. In one of her pieces—"Should we all have the same shape?"—she holds out the excess fabric of her trousers, contemplating her reflection in the mirror. In this way, Chinaza Nkemka's series, "Solitude", responds to Michelle's work through its depiction of bodies liberated in the privacy of their own homes. Meanwhile, David Olatoye's "Seeking Knowledge" imagines people as blossoms and reading, the watering act that takes place behind the scenes.

Participating artists are Ayogu Kingsley, Boris Anje, Chinaza Nkemka, Damilola Opedun, David Olatoye, Emma Odumade, Johnson Ocheja, Michelle Okpare, Talut Kareem and Wasiu Eshinlokun.

On the Fringe offers an avenue for reassessing the significance of the world that doesn't always meet the eye, positioning it as the starting point of our existential musings.





BORIS ANJE

Biography

Boris Anje (b. 1993) was born in Bamenda, Cameroon. He discovered art from his childhood. After his GCE AL in 2012, he passed the entrance examination into the Institute of Fine Arts Foumban (IFAF). 


KINGSLEY AYOGU


Biography



This led him to study painting and graphics at Enugu State College of Education. Ayogu's work can be described as stunning, lens-like detail oriented, depicting situations with a wide spectrum of displayed emotions through tears, despair and affinity. The viewer of his pieces is compelled to feel connected to his paintings.

WASIU ESHINLOKUN

Biography

Eshinlokun Wasiu (b. 1998) is a Surrealist artist. His work explores the way societal pressures force us to present inauthentic selves bound by fear, guilt, despondency, anxiety, or a need to please. The exaggerated positioning of his silhouetted figures, juxtaposed with bold braids of tape, creates an uncanny visual metaphor which represents this universal state of being. With his work he encourages us to access a free way of living, unbound by fear of being judged societally. His use of the shadow is a vehicle to depict collective humanity as, no matter where we come from, we all have a shadow. This concept of universal feeling drives much of his current practice.

TALUT KAREEM

Biography

Talut Kareem (b. 1994) is a contemporary artist based in Lagos, Nigeria. He received his National Diploma in Mass Communication at Moshood Abiola Polytechnic, and subsequently pursued a B.A. in Visual Art from the University of Lagos. His practice is rooted in drawing and painting, with painting being his primary form of expression.

Kareem creates richly detailed portraits by combining realistically rendered charcoal figures overlaid with bright colors and abstract patterns. By juxtaposing the monochrome of the charcoal with the colorful spherical shapes in the picture plane, he has developed a unique visual language, allowing him the freedom to explore figure composition, and further develop his narrative.

His practice centers around the transitory nature of our awareness, depicting the individual's emotional and mental states—as well as larger patterns of social behavior—while attempting to capture his own state of mind.










CHINAZA NKEMKA

JOHNSON OCHEJA

Biography

Johnson Ocheja (b. 1993) is a Nigerian artist from Kogi, Nigeria. Johnson's portraits highlight black consciousness and black beauty. His paintings depict detailed scenes of black subjects with blue pigment andin impasto technique created with his fingers, thereby producing marks on the skin of his subjects inspired by scarification. The marks represent an African cultural practice which shows a person's rank in society, family, clan, and tribe, and symbolises their beauty or strength and the blue pigment on the skin of his subjects symbolises royalty. His works challenge the conventional standard of beauty and are inspired by his environment, the community and from other artists such as GeraldLovell, Amoako Boafo, etc. He has lived in Kaduna, Nigeria and living in two different states has provided him with the knowledge of diversity in subjects including cultural beliefs, religion, ethnic identities, and racism. Thus, he uses his art to address these issues affecting his community. Johnson currently lives and works in Cross-River, Nigeria.



Biography

Biography

Damilola Moses Opedun, (b. 1983) is an artist who resides and creates in Lagos, Nigeria. His medium of choice is oil pigment on canvas, and his work blends contemporary and futuristic elements (such as modern-looking black figures and bold color combinations) with nods to times past (like Victorian fashion or centuries-old clothing). Through this fusion, Opedun aims to redefine true beauty and eliminate the racial divide. His work is a joyful retelling of our collective history, symbolically covering painful experiences with a fresh coat of paint and adding color to our painful past to make it more bearable to reminisce.
